



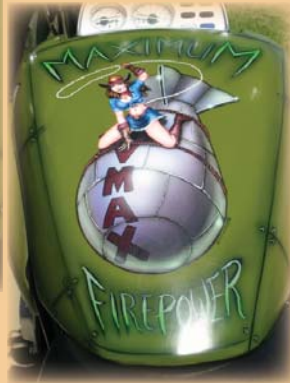
My Ride

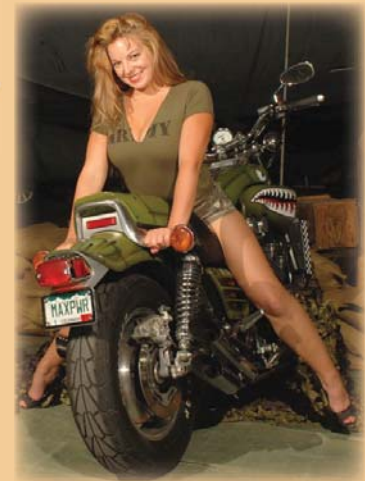
